INTRODUCTION

EuroMaintenance, the largest European conference on maintenance has existed since 1972 and is an initiative of the EFNMS (European Federation of National Maintenance Societies) and organized by the Dutch Maintenance Society NVDO in 2023. Maintenance NEXT is the most important platform for industrial maintenance in the Benelux.

The largest European maintenance conference will be held in Rotterdam from 17 to 19 April 2023. At the same time, Rotterdam Ahoy will be hosting the largest technology and maintenance exhibition in the Benelux from 18 to 20 April 2023: Maintenance NEXT.

Nowadays 69% of the asset data is stored digitally, a number that has been steadily increasing for years. However, 75% of the companies also indicates that they struggle with the translation of data into valuable and actionable business insights.

All in all there is a lot of trust in the future of the maintenance industry. This obscures a couple of fundamental issues with the industry's employee base, a shortage of technically schooled personnel, a large number of open vacancies, the low percentage of women in the industry and the high average age. Within this employee base a strong need for intra organisational cooperation is felt. This need has always been large, but never as large as it currently is.

Luckily there is a noticeable increase in the focus on innovations. A large group struggles however with the implementation of these innovations. It is key to combine these topics, investing in the right people, facilitating them in the right manner for them to cooperate and work with and on innovations.

These themes, combined with Safety, are central during EuroMaintenance. Not only during the interesting workshops and the plenary congress, but also during the Inspiring Tables. Do not miss it!

THE EFNMS MAINTENANCE BODY OF KNOWLEDGE

The European Federation of National Maintenance Societies (EFNMS), non-profit organisation gathering the National Maintenance Societies (NMS) of 24 European countries, has undertaken the development of a Maintenance Body of Knowledge (BoK). It contributes to the EFNMS mission to develop the maintenance profession and create a European maintenance culture.

The objective of the EFNMS BoK is to define the landscape, scope, and the content of maintenance, so that this area is better understood, better identified and its importance within organisations is more clearly apparent. It is based on the European maintenance standards and in particular those describing the maintenance process (EN17007) and the qualification of maintenance personnel (EN15628).

ORGANIZATIONAL QUALITATIVE CULTURE ASSESSMENT

Safety Culture gaps comes largely from the fact that there is a different perception among the various organizational levels on how to implement a Health & Safety Management System. This workshop (by George Scroubelos on behalf of EFNMS) will give the opportunity to the participants to use the innovative Six Pillar Tool to qualitatively assess their Organization's Safety Culture level. After a brief presentation of the Tool's contextual approach, each participant, depending on their relevant organizational line position, will be supplied with a questionnaire which will be called to answer to the best of their knowledge.

The questionnaire comprises six sets of targeted questions corresponding to the Pillars of Management Commitment, Total Employee Involvement, Effective Communication, Documentation, Management of Change and Continual Improvement. The Workshop serves not only as a benchmarking but also as a training module since each participant, going through the questions, identifies the management elements that, if implemented, may lead to effective accident prevention.
